I 94069531 PE Major Thabo Ntshisi current working at 46 SA Brigade Headquarters 1. at Rapid Deployment Air Operation Team 46. During the landing of Aircraft 9W 9900 in AF Base Waterkloof I was working at Command Post Flight Centre.

The flight clearance request can come in two ways to Command Post, either from the 2. requestor or from Dirco on behalf of the requestor. In this case it came from the requestor itself which was the Indian Embassy.

The procedure on such case as an Operator or Ops Clerk was to fax to email to 3. different Departments as followed: Air Traffic Navigations Service (ATNS), the Civil Aviation Authority (CAA), the Department of Transport (DoT), the Defense Foreign Relations (DFR), the Senior Staff Officer (SSO), the Department of Home Affairs (DHA) and Chief of Joint Operations (CJ OPS).

Once the process has been completed, you than wait for Note Verbale from Dirco 4. respond before creating the Flight Clearance Number of the requestor. During the waiting period it happened the requestor (CAPT SHAJI KUTTY) was calling the Command Post pushing to know when would be flight clearance granted.

It was normal to communicate with Dirco more specially with Mr Willian Matjila for any 5. awaiting Note Verbale to be process. I called him to find out about the Note Verbale of that Aircraft because the requestor was very much impatient. During our convencation with Mr William Matjila he then indicated to me that I should contat Mr Vusi Koloane who's dealing with that request.

It was a matter of calling and not getting him in the office during that time, and he 6. would return my call, indeed my call was returned by Mr Vusi Koloane. During our talks we didn't agree each other for creating the flight clearance number, the main reason was a purpose of visit from the requestor, it was stated that the purpose of visit was 'DELEGATION ex summered VISITe that wasn't a strong reason to granted a civil aircraft to land on the Military Base. I further explained to him, to whom may be granted such permission to utilize AF Base Waterkloof, The President, Deputy President and envoy of the President. During our discussion he mentioned Lt Col Anderson from Movements at AF-Base Waterkloof

7. I called Lt Col Anderson to get more information about the matter, she wasn't in the office that time, but was going to return my call, indeed my call was returned. Immediately, she asked me I understand you are rejecting to grant a flight clearance number to Ambassador Koloane, my respond 'yes' because of the reasons I explained to him.

8. On the JCPS CLUSTER REPORT dated 17 May 2013 on page 08 paragraph 2.1.17 that was my discussion with Lt Col Anderson. I agree with that paragraph. After that talk with Lt Col Anderson I immediately received the call from Ambassador Koloane.

9. Again on the JCPS CLUSTER REPORT dated 17 May 2017 on page 08 paragraph 2.1.18 that was my discussion with Chief of State Protocol Mr Vusi Koloane, he was confirming the discussion between me and LT Col Anderson. I agree with the paragraph.

10. During the discussion in the office about the matter, we received the Note Verbale from Mr William Matjila from Dirco.

11. On the JCPS CLUSTER REPORT dated 17 May 2013 on page 08 paragraph 2.1.20, that was a relief moment for me because the Note Verbale was sent to Command Post Flight Center. When the whole process was concluded and the file was ready to be sing by Senior Control Air Officer which was Lt Col van Zyl that time. As a person was preparing the whole file, it was my duty to explain to LT Col van Zyl the challenges I encountered till the receiving the Note Verbale. The request was signed by him and was also sent to different Departments as procedure.

AFFIDAVIT TO THE STATE CAPTURE COMMISSION

I, the undersigned,

BENEDICT MARTINS

Do hereby make oath and state:

- I was approached by the investigators of the Commission and was requested to respond to certain questions which relate to the Waterkloof incident. The list of questions was received by me on Friday, 21 June 2019. I was also furnished with the JCPS Report which was compiled by the Cluster on the landing of a chartered commercial aircraft at the Waterkloof Airforce Base.
- The facts deposed to herein are true and correct and are within my personal knowledge except where the context indicates otherwise. I deal with each of the questions below.

My role as Minister of Transport during May 2013.

- I was appointed as the Minister of Transport on the 11 June 2012 and held that position until the 9th June 2013
- 4. During May 2013, I carried out my responsibilities of overseeing the Department of Transport: Those were, *inter alia*:

Hoi +

- 4.1 The responsibility for National and International Airports, National Roads, Railways and Marine Transport.
- 4.2 Responsible for the effective implementation of transport legislation, policies, and programmes that are aimed to improve the lives of South Africans and to stimulate social and economic growth.

4.3 The Department of Transport further has a mandate to oversee the implementation of projects by entities under its ambit.

The role of the Department of Transport on Aviation matters, approvals, that he must give etc.

5. The National Aviation Security Programme (NASP) deals with matters of civil aviation security and with liaison with government departments concerning matters of civil aviation security. One of the key components of aviation security is a National Aviation Security Programme. The Civil Aviation Act (ACT No 13 of 2009) and associated regulation together with this programme, established the basic legal Authority for the implementation of Civil Aviation Security policies, practices, and procedures.

- 6. The SA aviation authority bears responsibility for the safety and security of the entire network of Airports, in terms of legislation and international conventions on safety and security.
- 7. Sharing this responsibility are the civil aviation's authorities of South Africa; the airports company of SA; the air traffic navigation services and the regulation committees.
- 8. The Minister makes decisions and approvals on Aviation in consultation with the relevant agencies that a particular matter requires.

If anyone approached me on the Waterkloof issue, and my response to the request and the full reasons for those reasons.

- No-one approached me on the Waterkloof landing issue because the Air Force Base Waterkloof falls under the Department of Defence and Military Veterans and not the Department of Transport.
- 10. The Airforce Base Waterkloof is a strategic military base that resorts under the Defence Act, (Act 44 of 1957).

Whether I was invited to the Gupta wedding, if so, who invited me and whether I attended.

11. I was invited to the Gupta wedding.

12. The invitation was delivered to my office.

13. The invitation was in the name of the bride and bridegroom.

14. I did not attend the wedding.

Whether I had issued any approvals or authorization for any aircrafts or helicopters or official aircraft that were going to land or depart from Waterkloof Airbase for the purposes of the wedding.

15. I did not issue any approvals or authorization for any aircrafts or helicopters or official aircraft that were going to land or depart from Waterkloof Airbase for the purposes of the wedding because I did not have the authority to do so.

Whether I had at any stage had a discussion or conversation with the former President on the request to land the aircraft at Waterkloof Airbase and the details thereof.

16. I did not have any discussion or conversation with the former President on the request to land aircraft at the Waterkloof Airbase.

How did I learn of the landing at Waterkloof and my reaction to it? Any steps I took thereafter to deal with the issue.

17. I learned of the landing from an official at the Air Traffic and Navigations Service who informed me that the Civil Aviation Authority (CAA), held that the airline. for the flight did not have a Foreign Operators Permit prior to its arrival in SA and would have to impose a fine of R80 000 on the airline. My response was that they should impose the fine and ensure that the flight had the required FOP, as the absence thereof was an infringement of Civil Aviation regulations and a condition of the flight clearance.

Details of when I was moved from the Ministry.

 I was released of my responsibility as the Minister of Transport on the 9th of June 2013.

Comments on the report of JCPS cluster and any matters contained therein that relate to me.

- 19.1 have read the JCPS report. My recollection of the sequence of events is captured correctly on page 6 paragraph 2.1.9 of the report, namely:
 - 19.1 In February 2013 Mr Tony Gupta approached the Airport Company South Africa to enquire about the use of OR Tambo International Airport (ORTIA) for the arrival of at least five heads of state,

ministers and senior Indian government officials invited to a four-day wedding event at Sun City (source: ACSA Report; NICOC report 1 May 2013)

- 19.2 A meeting took place with Mr Tony Gupta, the Chief of State Protocol Mr Koloane, the acting Chief Executive Officer of ACSA, Mr Bongani Maseko and Minister of Transport Mr Ben Martins. At the meeting Mr Tony Gupta requested "to use facilities at the airport to welcome guests from India who were to attend a wedding" (source: Statement by Minister Martins 13 May 2013). It was concluded that it would not be possible to use ORTIA given the request for an elaborate welcoming ceremony; this was a space used by the Department of Home Affairs for checking passports. Minister Martins agreed with ACSA's explanation (source: NICOC Report 1 May 2013; written statement by Minister Martins).
- 19.3 ACSA suggested that alternatives be considered, among them Lenasia or Pilanesburg airports. It was later determined that the runaway at Lenasia was being upgraded.
 - 19.4 At a follow-up meeting and after enquiring with SAA, ACSA informed Mr Gupta that the apron at Pilanesberg could not accommodate an Airbus A330-200 (Source: ACSA Report)

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




