IT IS ORDERED THAT:

- This application is heard as one of urgency in terms of Rule 6(12) of the Uniform Rules of Court and the forms and service provided for in the Rules are dispensed with:
- 2. A rule *nisi* is hereby issued calling upon the following parties:

2.8. The Council for the Advancement of the South African Constitution, which is a non-governmental organisation with its offices at 7 Olympia Court, 85 Durban Road, Mowbray, Cape Town;

to show cause on **2 October 2018** at 10h00 or so soon thereafter as the matter may be heard why an order should not be made in the following terms:

- 2.8.1. The period of 180 days referred to in paragraph 4.3 of this Court's order dated 13 December 2017 in the matter of President of the Republic of South Africa v the Office of the Public Protector and Others 2018 (2) SA 100 (GP) is extended for a further 24 (twenty-four) months calculated from 1 March 2018;
- 2.8.2. The President of the Republic of South Africa is directed to take such steps as are necessary to give effect to the order referred to in paragraph 2.8.1 above, including the amendment of paragraph 5 of Proclamation 3 of 2018 published in Government Gazette no 41403 of 25 January 2018, to reflect the extended period.

2.9. Pending the return day the order in paragraphs 2.8.1 and 2.8.2 above shall be of immediate force and effect.
